2. 2019 State Legisla ve Prior es

Communications & Fubric Affairs Director Randy Beehler reported on the City's state legislative priorities including actively pursue, support and monitor. Senator Honeyford recommended the City may want to investigate a fuel tax on commercial airlines. Representative Chandler reported that Astria plans to convert the Toppenish hospital to a mental health facility.

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Senator Honeyford reported he is working on a large water bill that would provide reliable funding for water projects, stormwater, flood control, water supply and culverts. He stated this will be on a competitive basis with priority to areas that have water plans such as the Yakima River Basin Plan. He is also working on a bill similar to those in Oregon and California to eliminate the change on daylight savings time.

Representative Chandler is working on judicial scrutiny and an oversight board for the Public Defenders Association. City Manager Moore noted the City will spend \$1.2 million on indigent defense in 2018 with only \$80,000 coming from the state for support.

Representative Mosbrucker stated domestic violence and teen suicide prevention are some of her biggest priorities, as well as pro business bills, seatbelts on school buses. Representative-Elect Corry stated his focus will be on helping families in Eastern Washington as well as developing business friendly ways to control health care costs.
