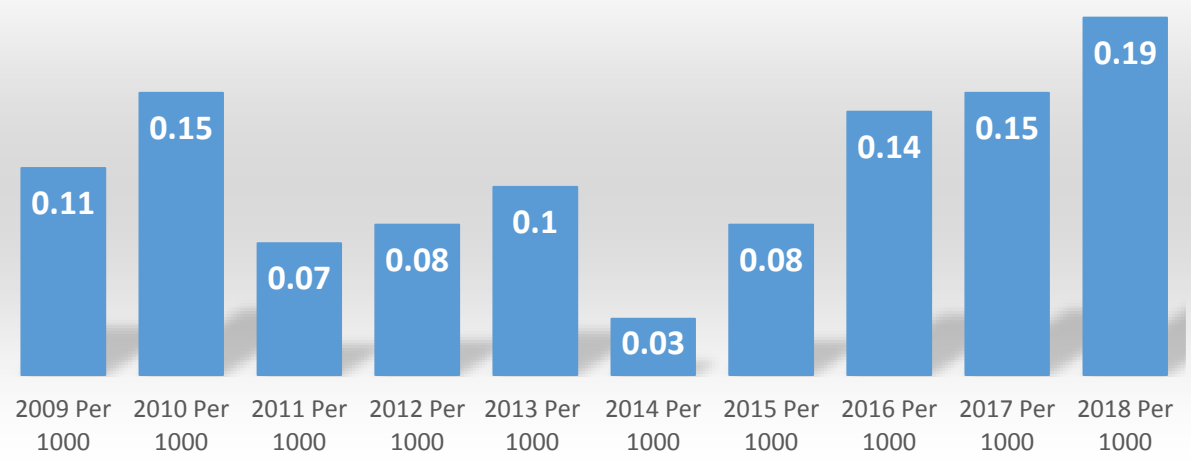

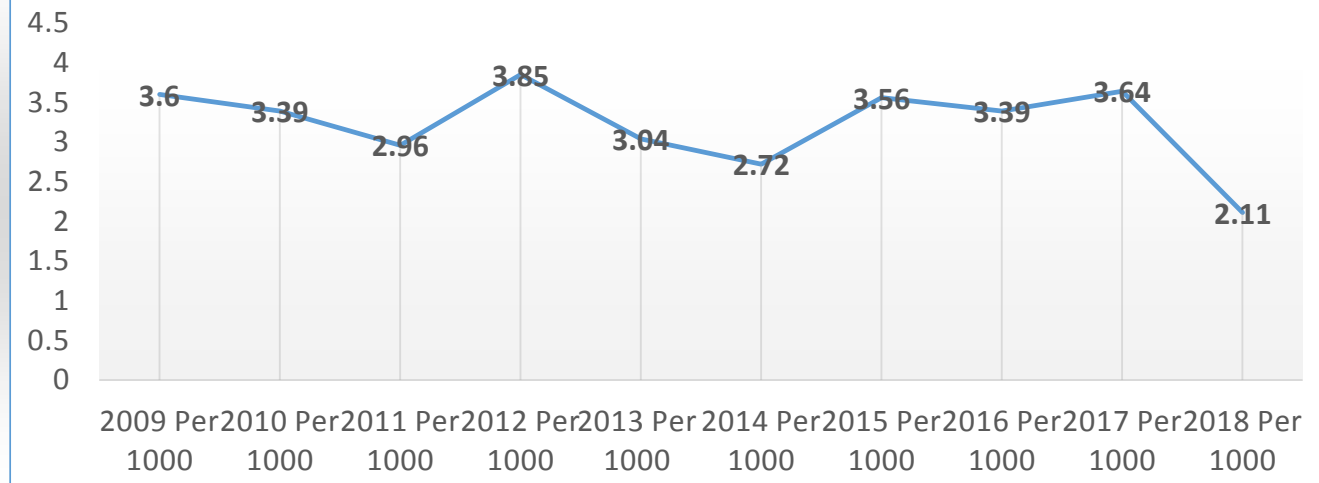


YAKIMA POLICE DEPARTMENT 10 YEAR CRIME RATE COMPARISON

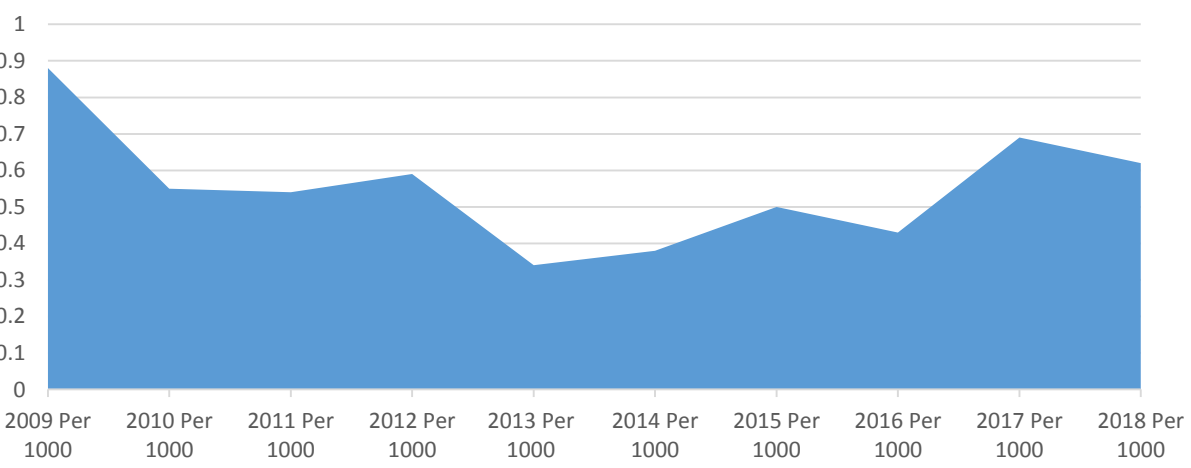
Murder



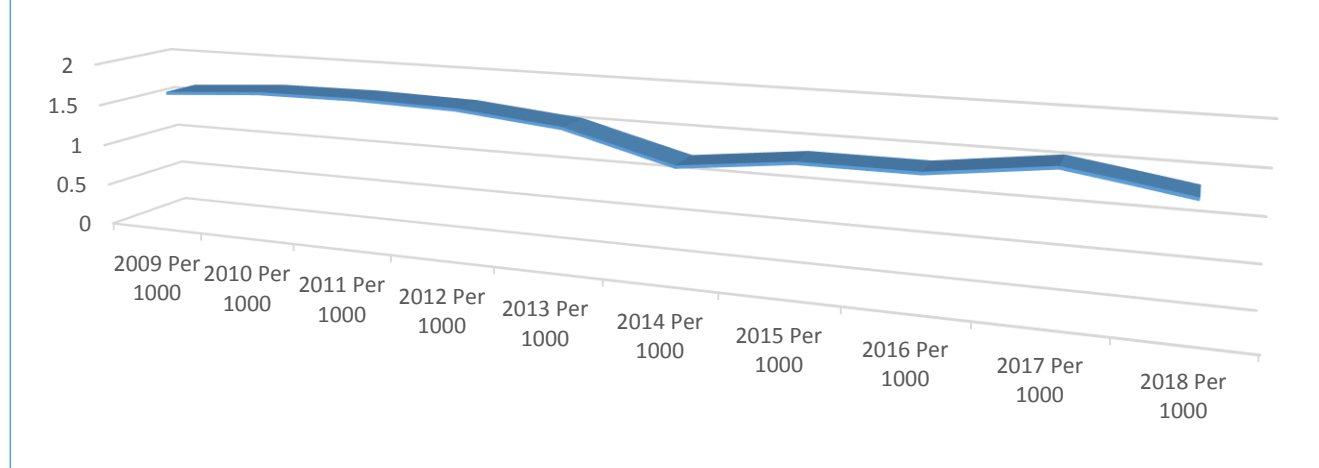
Aggravated Assault

In 2017, WASPC reported the state-wide homicide clearance rate was 55%





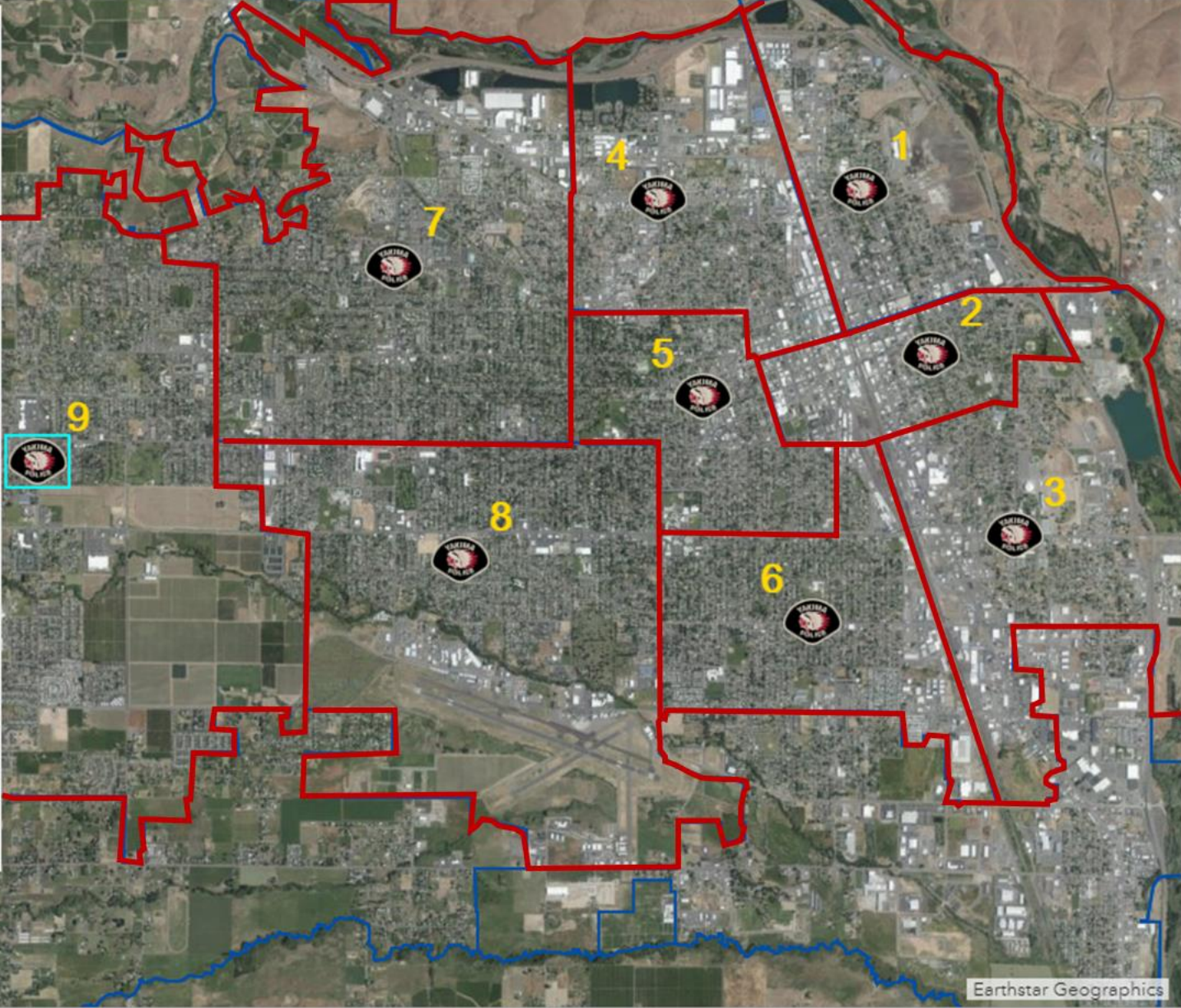
