RESOLUTION NO. R-2020-

A RESOLUTION authorizing an Agreement between the City of Yakima, ESD 105 and Comprehensive Healthcare for the Washington State Healthy Transitions Project

WHEREAS, the City of Yakima (City) was the recipient of a 5 year federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) grant for the Washington State Healthy Transitions Project (HTP) in 2019; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City to enter into an agreement with ESD 105 and Comprehensive Healthcare (Comp HC) to provide the services and staff necessary for such a program; and

WHEREAS, under this SAMHSA grant, the City must provide low-barrier access to HTP services for transition-age youth (TAY) ages 16-25 experiencing serious emotional disturbance/serious mental illness with services being provided that include behavioral health services, physical health services, independent living skills, peer support, and community-based recovery support; and

WHEREAS, ESD 105 shall ensure that a minimum of 150 TAY outreach and engagement contacts are made; and

WHEREAS, Comp HC shall ensure that a minimum of 80 TAY outreach and engagement in community-based interventions and that a minimum of 80 TAY have accessed behavioral health treatment as a result of their participation in the HTP; and

WHEREAS, total consideration payable to the City under the SAMHSA grant and available to ESD 105 and Comp HC for reimbursement shall not exceed \$299,988 per year; and

WHEREAS, the City Council feels that the HTP is in the best interest of the community, now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF YAKIMA:

The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to execute Agreement with ESD 105 and Comprehensive Healthcare, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, to provide behavioral health services, physical health services, independent living skills, peer support and community-based recovery support for individuals between the ages of 16-25.
