





Yakima council to hear public comment, consider property code revision

The Yakima City Council will accept live public comment for the first time in months when it meets Tuesday.

The council approved remote public comment Jan. 19. City Hall has been alocad to the public and the up to comment. Only comments regarding an item on the council's regular meeting agenda for the day will be allowed.

People who sign up by 3 p.m. on the day of the council meeting will be called on by the Zoom host in the order



The #COVID19 vaccine center at State Fair Park will provide 1,200 injections per day starting Wednesday. That's a six-fold increase thanks to support from the federal government.






