## A RESOLUTION

authorizing an amendment to City Contract 2019-033 to provide for direct transportation between the Henry Beauchamp Jr. Community Center (HBCC) and Franklin Pool.

**WHEREAS**, the City of Yakima (City) owns the HBCC and is managed, operated and maintained by OIC as a neighborhood facility to meet the needs and desires of the neighboring community, youth, the poor and the disadvantaged; and

**WHEREAS**, the City has provided Transit service for several years at no charge for youths attending the HBCC summer programs to be transported to Franklin Pool; and

**WHEREAS**, because the City's Transit service must remain a "public route" in accordance with the Federal Transportation Association (FTA), the transportation of youths from the HBCC to Franklin Pool can be extremely lengthy in travel time; and

**WHEREAS**, there is a desire between the City and OIC to be able to provide HBCC a "direct route" to and from Franklin Pool for the youths; and

**WHEREAS**, a charter bus service could provide the direct route since it does not operate under the authority of FTA; and

**WHEREAS**, OIC would select and coordinate with a charter bus service to provide the necessary transportation to and from Franklin Pool, and the City would reimburse OIC for the transportation costs in an amount not to exceed \$6,000 per year; and

**WHEREAS**, the desire is for the City to provide the funding for the transportation services each summer until such time the MLK Jr. Pool is open to the public; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Yakima finds that it is in the best interest of the City and its residents to amend the current agreement with OIC to allow for the City to reimburse OIC for the transportation services; now, therefore

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF YAKIMA:

The City Manager is hereby authorized to execute the attached amendment to the Agreement with OIC, allowing the City to reimburse OIC for transportation services in an amount not to exceed SIX THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$6,000) per year until the pool at MLK Jr. Park is operational.
